HUMAN MIGRATION REDUX


In 2005 and 2006 a VISTAS course was offered on Human Migrations. Over 100 VISTAS members participated in the course. A principal focus of the sessions was the understanding of migrations that has resulted from the emerging technology for sequencing DNA.

This course will report on the new developments that have been published since 2006. We know more about our African forebears, the Neanderthal peoples, the Flores Islanders and even a new hominid species which lived along side the Cro-Magnon and Neanderthal peoples, we think. There are new findings concerning the peopling of the Americas and the possible ties of the South Americans to the colonization of Polynesia. The importance of climate change in the movement and development of modern humans seems to be receiving greater emphasis by the professional commentators. There are of course anomalies and contradictions everywhere in the record of migrations. We will look at some of these.

For those who have not followed these topics closely in recent years we will spend a little time looking at some of the underlying technology which this topics draws upon. For example we will look at how DNA gives us an understanding of human movements. We will examine some of the climate proxies that tell us what climate was

like in the distant past. Perhaps we will have time to look at carbon dating and newer dating techniques that allow us to place archaeological finds in an historic context.

If you have any family heirlooms that date back to 10,000, 30,000 or 50,000 years ago please feel free to bring them to the class.
