This seminar is structured in response to VISTAS members' requests. The emphasis of the course will be on two aspects of the era, everyday life and the underlying factors that shaped the Age.

Our presenters are three professors, a lawyer, the owner of a computer software firm, and a financial consultant. They will give a subjective insight into the underlying trends and developments that molded the Middle Ages. Each will discuss a topic that either they have studied in their professional lives or in which they have a particular interest.

We will have two classes on everyday life. First, a visual presentation of Denmark at the time of the Plague. Second, contributions by class members on the way people lived in the Middle Ages. There will be ample time for class discussion and input on these subjects or on different topics that are of group interest.

Our text supplies the dates, events, and people who were significant over this thousand-year period. We strongly recommend that participants do the reading before the program begins.
