## MODELS OF DEMOCRACY



People are asking questions about democracy as never before. In the past twenty years, a large number of countries—including most of the former Soviet bloc—have adopted or re-adopted democracy as a form of government, but this naturally raises difficult issues: What type of democracy should we adopt? Will it work? In established democracies, too, these same concerns appear in various forms: Can we get more people involved in government and politics? Can we make the government more responsive to voters? Can we make it more effective?

The painful reality is that there are no simple answers to these questions: total participation can mean total gridlock; defending democratic values can mean defying public opinion. This dilemma means that any system of democratic governance must make trade-offs between democratic virtues, and the various types of democracy that exist in the world today—presidential, semi-presidential, parliamentary, and the like—strike very different trade-offs.

In this course, we will examine the origins of these different types of democracy and examine the particular balances they strike between the sometimes conflicting goals of effectiveness, responsiveness, and preservation of fundamental values. Our objectives are to survey the full democratic 'menu,' to understand better why countries make different choices from that menu, and to evaluate the consequences of these different choices.
