This lecture discussion will provide an in-depth view of the historical and political events leading to apartheid, what it was like for white and black South Africans to live under that regime, and the legacy of the anti-apartheid movement and its aftermath in this extraordinary country today. The lecture will also provide a context in which to understand the current turmoil in South African politics and what the future might hold.

Discussion topics include:

- Historical background leading to advent of apartheid: Roots of the conflict between Dutch and English settlements, 1652-1890.
- Impact of World War I and World War II resulting in codification of apartheid as law of the land, 1914-1948.
- Life under apartheid rule and growing unrest culminating in peaceful overthrow of apartheid government, 1948-1994.
- Post-apartheid era under Nelson Mandela and the African National Congress, 1994-2016.
- Current crisis of leadership in South Africa today and the future of the country.

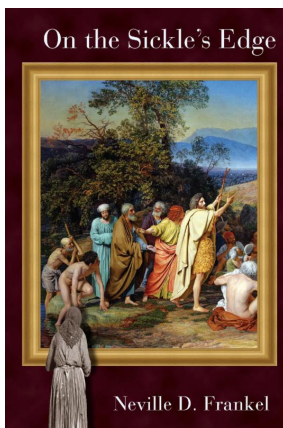

BIOGRAPHY: Born in Johannesburg, South Africa, *Neville Frankel* immigrated to Boston with his family when he was 14. After graduating from Dartmouth College, he pursued doctoral work in English literature at the University of Toronto. While in Canada, he wrote *THE THIRD POWER*, a well-reviewed political thriller about the transformation of Rhodesia to Zimbabwe. He also received an Emmy for his work on a BBC/Frontline documentary. In 2005 he returned to South Africa for the first time in 38 years. Over the next decade he went back several more times, researching what would become *BLOODLINES*.



Neville was honored to be a 2013 Jewish Book Council Author and a 2013-2014 Boston Book Lab Author. He has participated in more than 90 speaking engagements around the country, including a presentation to the South African Ambassador to the US. He has recently completed a new novel, *ON THE SICKLE’S EDGE*, a prequel to *BLOODLINES*, a work of historical fiction set in Eastern Europe during the last century.



There will be a book premier event for his new novel, “On the Sickle’s Edge,” a searing new novel of historical fiction on the Eastern European Jewish Experience, on Sunday February 19, 2017, at 3 p.m. at Congregation B’nai B’rith.

Other parts of the program include David Bisno as emcee, introductory remarks by Hannah-Beth Jackson, Russian classical music by Opera Santa Barbara Mosher Artists Studio, and a Russian tea room reception.
