
WILL CHINA (STILL) EAT OUR LUNCH? How Best to Deal with a Rising Superpower

Presented by: Rich Appelbaum and Denis Simon

Thursday, April 4, 2024 9:30 a.m. – 12 noon.

In this class we take a deep dive into the complex landscape of China's rise as a technological and economic powerhouse, exploring its ramifications for US–China relations, especially in light of the recent meeting between President Xi and President Biden in November 2023. The spotlight is on the "Chinese model"— state-led capitalism combining multi-year government plans with targeted public investment and dynamic private enterprise. For two decades this strategy proved to be highly successful — but has it reached its limits? Recent uncertainties,



such as President Xi Jinping's authoritarian direction and evolving U.S. "containment" policies, challenge previous assumptions about China's trajectory. Coined terms like "Peak China" suggest that perhaps a reassessment is needed. We scrutinize the alleged threat, weighing the arguments for and against sustained S&T cooperation between the U.S. and China amidst pressing global challenges like climate change and pandemics.

Dr. Richard Appelbaum is Distinguished Professor Emeritus and former MacArthur Foundation Chair in Global and International Studies and Sociology at UCSB, where he served as chair of the Sociology Dept.; Director of the Institute for Social, Behavioral, and Economic Research; and co-founder of UCSB's Global & International Studies Program. He received his PhD in Sociology from the University of Chicago. He was co-principal investigator at the National Science Foundation's Center for Nanotechnology in Society (2006–2017), where he led an international research team studying the rise of China as an S&T power.





Dr. Denis Simon is a well-known expert on China's business, technology, and innovation strategies, with over 40 years of experience studying and working in China. He received his PhD in Political Science from UC Berkeley. In 2021–2022, he served as Executive Director of the Center for Innovation Policy at the Law School at Duke University. From 2015 to 2020, he held the post of Executive Vice Chancellor of Duke Kunshan University, a Sino–US joint venture in Jiangsu, China. In 2006 he received the China National Friendship Award from then–Premier Wen Jiabao in the Great Hall of the People in Beijing.
