With the Middle East in utter turmoil, during four intensive weeks we're going to ask important questions here in Santa Barbara. We won't settle the problems but, hopefully, we'll come to understand the competing claims, appreciate the history, and realize why a solution is so difficult. From Abraham to Herzl, from Arafat to Netanyahu, we'll ask:

What does the Bible have to do with it, anyway? Whose land has it been, anyway? Why can't these people just get along, anyway? Who is Jewish, anyway? ... and who has the Right of Return? Are all Muslims Arabs? Do all Arabs embrace Islam? Are all Israelis Jewish? Why Israel? Why the Jews? Can an "apartheid" government be "democratic"? Is there a solution? What might it look like?


It is suggested that you read one or all of these well-written books: *Israel — A Concise History of a Nation Reborn*, by Daniel Gordis, OR *My Promised Land*, by Ari Shavit, AND *The Hundred Years' War on Palestine*, by Rashid Khalidi. The books are available at Chaucer's and online.

Presentations will be accompanied by vivid, colorful, historical slides. You will be given an outline for each class to allow easy following. At 1 p.m. each afternoon, following lunch, we will view a riveting movie—the subject matter and narrative balanced between Palestinian and Jewish points of view.
