

# LEGENDARY LOVERS IN OPERA

There is one theme in opera that has been treated more frequently than any other, and that is Romantic love. Indeed, there are very few operas that do not, to a greater or lesser degree, feature Romantic love as a principal concern. Perhaps one of the major reasons for this is the suitability of operatic music to explore all aspects of the absorbing phenomenon of this emotional experience, which is central to human life.



In three separate sessions, Simon Williams will explain why Romantic love has been such a persistent preoccupation for composers of opera and explore how such love has been seen as both a blessing and a curse. In particular Professor Williams will focus on the unsettling association, even on the interdependence, of Romantic love and death. The operas he will discuss are taken from the mainstream repertoire. The first talk will center on Donizetti's *Lucia di Lammermoor* and Verdi's *La traviata*, two of the classic tragedies of the Romantic age; the second talk will explore contrasting concepts of love in Wagner's *Die Walküre* and *Tristan und Isolde*; the final talk will focus on Bizet's *Carmen*, Massenet's *Thais*, and Zandonai's *Francesca da Rimini*.

All talks will include video extracts and should be of interest both to those who are new to opera and to seasoned operagoers.
