The SB Civil Grand Jury THE PUBLIC'S WATCHDOG

Would you like to see local government operate efficiently or effectively and be transparent and accountable? If so, you may wish to take this in-depth course centered on the *Santa Barbara Civil* (*"Watchdog"*) *Grand Jury* system.

We will explore the history of the grand jury, dating back to the 12th century, and look at its evolution in both England and the colonies, as well as its incorporation into the US Constitution. We will distinguish between the criminal accusation function, still widely used in federal and many

state courts, and the local civil watchdog function.

The grand jury is an arm of the Superior Court. It has the *legal authority* and, in some cases, the *duty* to analyze and report on the management and operations of all Santa Barbara County agencies. To deeply explore local hot-button legal, political, and social justice issues, the class will read a few 2022-23 Grand Jury reports and local government responses to them. Participants will be better prepared to follow complex local political debates in 2024.

Stan Roden J.D. is a retired civil trial lawyer with a background that includes criminal defense, two terms as Santa Barbara County District Attorney, mediator, and SB Legal Aid volunteer. He served on the CA Fair Political Practices Commission, taught numerous courses at local schools (SBCC, UCSB Extension, Antioch University), and served on many community boards and committees, most recently focused on criminal justice reform, environmental sustainability, and climate change.



Stan is uniquely qualified to teach this course. He served on the 2022–2023 Santa Barbara County Grand Jury and as chair of the Criminal Justice Committee. This Grand Jury issued seven reports, four of which involved five deaths in custody. Each included detailed findings and recommendations for improved criminal justice system operations for those suffering from mental illness and/or substance abuse.
