#### Dr. Steve Windhager, Executive Director, Santa Barbara Botanic Garden

After receiving his B.A. in Philosophy from Texas A&M University, Steve Windhager went on to the University of North Texas to complete his Masters in Environmental Ethics. He subsequently completed his Ph.D. work in environmental science, focusing on restoration ecology of prairie systems. A national leader in sustainable development and ecological restoration, Steve helped develop and was the first

director of the Sustainable Sites Initiative (SITES), a joint project of the Lady Bird Johnson Wildflower Center and the U. S. Botanic Garden and the American Society of Landscape Architects. He currently serves as Executive Director of the Santa Barbara Botanic Garden, the nation's oldest botanic garden dedicated exclusively to native plants.
